Last Meeting

Our speaker for the meeting was Marie Farran from the TN Agency on Aging. She works as an Ombudsman and legal advocate in the matters of long term care and Medicare. Her office in Cookeville serves 14 counties in the Upper Cumberland area. For many people as they get older and in failing health face the need for nursing home care. She talked on the high cost of such care which runs 4 - 6 thousand dollars per month and the ways it is paid for. Medicare will only pay for a very limited amount and time, after that we would need a long term care insurance plan or we would have to pay out of pocket. For those who had no way to pay for nursing home care, she went on to talk about under which circumstances Medicaid would pay. It is a very complex set of rules that the State of Tennessee goes by and we would certainly need to get help from her office to understand. She also made mention of a training program for those interested in helping others with these matters.
