Minutes of Meetings  
June 19, 2012

The Cookeville chapter of NARFE met June 19 at Shoney's Restaurant with 13 members and guests present. Meeting was opened by an invocation and pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The speaker was Mary Daniels with the Putnam County Family YMCA.

President Collins provided copies of the report on what NARFE is doing in regards to Legislation and the Postal Service. He encouraged members to pass this report to those they know who work for the Postal Service in hopes it would help them to decide to become members of NARFE.

President Collins reported that NARFE President, Joe Beaudoin has sent a letter to each member of Congress urging them to not increase what current federal employees pay toward the retirement system to pay for the bill that will prevent the student loan program interest rates to go up beginning in July. President Obama wants to force federal employees to pay an extra 1.2 percent towards the retirement system.

He also reported the latest facts on the Consumer Price Index in which our Cost of Living Adjustments are made. The latest report for May showed a decline of 0.2 percent in the cost of living. As it stands now, the index is 1.5 percent higher than the end of the last reporting year. There are 4 more reporting months in this year.
