Treasurer's Report: The December Treasurer report showed dues received \$71.92, paid to the TN federation \$378.00 and a balance at the end of the month \$1,463.74. We also received money and paid out for the luncheon in which we netted \$4.25.

Alzheimer's Report: A collection was taken for Alzheimer's in the amount of \$20.55.
