It would require current postal retirees to enroll in Medicare Part B to continue receiving their current health insurance coverage through the FEHBP.

Fair Act of 2017 would give federal employees a 3.2 percent pay increase in 2018.

Alzheimer's Report: A collection was taken for Alzheimer's in the amount of \$15.
