Legislation Report

I would encourage you to read the article in the February issue of the NARFE magazine on page 16 for a list of the many legislative accomplishments during the 1st Session of the 111th. Congress (2009). Even though we have not been able to accomplish everything that we would wish for, there have been many items that help not only retired federal employees, but those currently employed also.

President Obama has submitted his 2011 budget proposals to Congress. This is for the fiscal year that begins in October this year. As you know this is a very lengthy process with many changes along the way, but a preliminary examination of it shows no major changes or programs which would adversely impact federal retirees. Our association president Margaret Baptiste has praised the Administration's re-embrace of the pay parity between federal civilians and members of the uniformed services. Down through the years NARFE in working with Congress has been able to prevent negative impacts for our members which is a tremendous reason to belong to and support NARFE. Our NARFE staff will continue to monitor this in the months to come.

Government Retiree Tax Credit

When filing your federal income tax form for 2009, don't forget about the special \$250 credit for those retired from the U S Government. This is part of the economic recovery bill passed by Congress last year. Each retiree can claim this credit on their 2009 tax form if they did not receive a similar payment because of Social Security benefits.

Be Prepared For Life's Events

It has been awhile since this useful publication was mentioned. NARFE has put together a guide that greatly helps us list all the important information that is always needed at a time of death. This publication is called *Be Prepared For Life's Events*, Form F-100. This is a handy place to record all your personal information, civil service records, military service records, Social Security information, insurance and investments records. We all would be wise to fill out or update this as needed.
