Well Congress has finally passed and the President has signed legislation to increase the debt ceiling of the U S Government, I am not sure that is a good thing but it most likely will have great impact on all Americans both present and future.

Here is a statement from our NARFE President "On behalf of our nation's more than 4 million federal workers and retirees and the Americans they serve, it is a great relief that a deal has been reached to keep the government moving forward. There is also temporary relief in the news that, so far, no sweeping plans have been enacted that would weaken our federal workers' retirement and health benefits."

"Unfortunately, the nearly \$1 trillion in spending reductions across federal agencies will be a challenge to absorb, and once again federal workers will get the chance to demonstrate their skill at doing more with less. As the debt negotiations continue through the end of the year, I hope our leaders continue to recognize the value of our nation's federal workforce and the sacrifices they are undertaking to get our country back on solid financial ground."
