Notes From The Last Meeting

It was a cold, cold night for our last meeting. Even with that and the fact that some could not make it because of injuries, the attendance was not down as much as I was afraid that it would be.

I am sure that most of you are animal lovers which prompted a suggestion for our program last month. We had Linda Westin and Debi Smith from the Cookeville/Putnam County Animal Shelter. No they did not bring any furry creatures with them, but they did talk about the need for animal shelter and about the new facility that they will have just moved into.

Linda said that about 68% of households have pets, there are even more pets than babies in this county. Speaking about the need to control the dog and cat population, she said that in just a few short years 1 dog could produce 67,000 more dogs and 1 cat could produce 370,000 more cats. That is why it is important to control the pet population.

The local animal shelter was begun in 2004 and for many years operated out of a location on W. Jackson St., but they are glad to be moving to a new 12,000 square foot facility on Gainesboro Grade right next to the Hyder-Burks Pavilion.

Of course they have animals available for adoption, they also provide spay and neuter services among many more services. They asked if anyone would be interested in volunteering which would be of great help to them. They welcome donations of cash and many other items. They are open Monday through Saturday from noon to 4pm. I am sure that if you call them at 931-526-DOGS(3647), they will answer any questions that you have and fill you in on ways that you can be of help to them.

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Membership Incentives

Between budget proposals, the debt ceiling deadline, an extension of the highway trust fund and other major policy debates, NARFE members could face serious threats to their earned retirement and health benefits early on in the new Congress.
