Notes From The Chapter President

The May program was something that none of us in the room had heard of before. Michelle Parrott, Director of the Putnam County UT Extension Office was our speaker and she told us about a new program that is called Money Managers. I believe this is a nationwide program and will become more popular as people become involved. Michelle was an excellent speaker and a delight to listen to.

Money Managers are those who assist mostly seniors with the keeping up with and seeing that bills are paid and similar type tasks. The purpose of this is to help seniors maintain independence, relieve the burden on caregivers and to protect against scams.

Those that do this work are called Daily Money Managers (DMM) and some of the things they can do are:

- Organizing and keeping track of financial, tax, medical and other records.
- Helping caregivers establish a budget
- Preparing and deliver of bank deposits
- Paying of bills
- Negotiating with creditors
- Writing checks and/or balancing a checkbook
- Making medical appointments and arranging transportation
- Sorting mail

Those who do this work do charge a fee but it normally does not take a lot of time and the costs should not be very expensive. Michelle passed out sheets about this and guidelines on how to find a DMM.. I can supply you with those or you can contact her or any local UT Extension Office.

In other news from the last meeting, it was good to hear reports about the recent Federation Convention, the Future of NARFE news and much on the topic of Legislation from our Legislative Chair.

I will have a few more comments in this newsletter about these items. I would encourage you to mark the 3rd Tuesday of the month on your calendars and try not to schedule anything that prevents attending.


