Legislative Report

Congress will be back in session about the second week in September. They will need to pass the authorization bills for FY24 so that federal agencies will have their funds for the year. The new fiscal year begins October 1st so there is not much time to pass all 12 of those bills by both houses of Congress.

Most likely they will pass a continuing resolution as they have done in previous years to keep funding available.

Not sure how much time will be devoted to working on the various bills that NARFE is supporting for our membership. Or all the other bills that have been proposed for this legislative session.

For the list of bills that NARFE is watching, look in the magazine and on the NARFE website. And don't forget to either call your members of Congress or email them to urge them to support our legislation and any other concerns that you have.

Pay Raise Proposed

President Biden has submitted his plan for the 2024 pay raise for federal workers and the military. He has proposed a 5.2 percent increase in pay. If approved, that would be the largest pay raise since 1980. The pay increase would be split between a 4.7 percent across the board increase and a 0.5 percent locality pay increase.

NARFE-FEEA Relief Available for Hawaii

The Federal Employee Education and Assistance Fund (FEEA) offers disaster relief grants to eligible federal employees when these disasters strike. FEEA has given over 14,000 grants since 1986, for wildfires, hurricanes, and other natural disasters, as well as for groceries, fuel, and diapers during the longest government shutdown in U.S. history. Thanks to the generosity of our fellow NARFE members, this assistance is available through the NARFE -FEEA Disaster Fund which offers up to \$500 in assistance for those who have lost their homes and/or had to evacuate.

FEEA stands ready to assist active and retired NARFE members impacted by the devastating fires in Maui.
